

Bequests & Memorial Giving



One way to carry on your charitable legacy is to leave a bequest to the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation. Making a charitable gift through your will or trust is a simple and tax-friendly way to support the causes, charities or community you love.

Bequest Benefits

With thoughtful planning, you can leave a significant impact on your community through a bequest from your will or trust. One benefit of making a bequest is that doing so allows you to continue to use the property you plan to leave to charity, during your lifetime. Charitable bequests of any amount are also exempt from federal estate taxes. If you have a taxable estate, the estate tax charitable deduction may offset or eliminate estate taxes, resulting in a larger inheritance for your heirs. A bequest can even create a permanent endowment fund in your name, allowing you to support the causes you care about in perpetuity.

Types of Bequests

A **specific bequest** involves making a gift of a specific dollar amount or a specific asset, such as a piece of real estate, a vehicle, or other property. For example, you may wish to leave \$10,000 or your home to the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation. Another kind of specific bequest involves leaving a specific percentage of your overall estate to charity. For example, you may wish to leave 10% of your estate to the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation.

A **residual bequest** is a bequest that is made from the balance of an estate after the will or trust has distributed each of the specific bequests. A common residual bequest involves leaving a percentage of the residue of the estate to charity. For example, you may wish to leave 30% of the residue of your estate to the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation.

Charitable Options

No matter which type of bequest you choose, you have the option of adding it to your own donor-advised fund, so your children or successor advisors can continue your charitable legacy, or contributing to one of our permanent endowments. Either will give back to the community forever through the power of endowment and protect your charitable intent forever.

If unrestricted, your bequest will be combined with gifts from thousands of other donors to help the community foundation meet Ross County's ever changing needs in perpetuity.

If restricted, your bequest will be used for the specific purpose stated in your will. You can designate a specific nonprofit(s), community, or area(s) of charitable interest to support through your own charitable fund. If a cause or organization ceases to exist, we will support similar causes or organizations in your name for generations to come.

MEMORIAL GIVING

Many of our donors and fundholders have indicated they would prefer to include requests for donations to their fund or another endowment fund at the community foundation in their obituaries in lieu of receiving flowers.

The following is sample language that can be used for this purpose:

Bequest Language

The Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation is happy to work with you and your advisors to ensure your charitable objectives are met through your estate plans. Specific Dollar Amount/Personal Property

I hereby give, devise and bequeath [dollar amount or description of property] to the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation, a nonprofit organization located at 45 E Main St., Chillicothe, OH 45601, Federal Tax ID #31-1480939, for the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation's general use (or to support the following fund, nonprofit(s), community or area(s) of charitable interest).

Specific Real Estate

I hereby give, devise and bequeath all of the right, title and interest in and to the real estate located at [address or description of property] to Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation, a nonprofit organization located at 45 E Main St., Chillicothe, OH 45601, Federal Tax ID #31-1480939, for the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation's general use (or to support the following fund, nonprofit(s), community or area(s) of charitable interest).

Percentage of an Estate

I hereby give, devise and bequeath [percentage] of my estate to Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation, a nonprofit organization located at 45 E Main St., Chillicothe, OH 45601, Federal Tax ID #31-1480939, for Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation's general use (or to support the following fund, nonprofit(s), community or area(s) of charitable interest).

Residual

I hereby give, devise and bequeath to the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation, a non-profit organization located at 45 E Main St., Chillicothe, OH 45601, Federal Tax ID #31-1480939, [all or X%] of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate for the Chillicothe-Ross Community Foundation's general use (or to support the following fund, nonprofit(s), community or area(s) of charitable interest).

Other planned giving options
